**4. Describe the action steps the school/district will take to reduce the opportunity gap in student possession of ASB cards and/or participation in extracurricular activities for the upcoming school year.**

Auburn School District (ASD) is a CEP District, and this year OSPI has shifted back to requiring families to complete the CNEEB form to help qualify for services, moving away from the Family Income Survey process used in the past two years. ASD and our schools actively inform families about the specific services available, such as HB 1660, and other benefits they can access once they complete the CNEEB form and receive OSPI approval. After families submit the form and receive OSPI approval, schools follow up to ensure they understand the benefits they qualify for. We've also increased awareness of the importance of completing the CNEEB form and the positive impact it can have for students.

To reduce the opportunity gap in student access to ASB cards and extracurricular activities, the student leadership programs will provide information to families during high school registration days. Additionally, schools will make computers available for families to complete the online CNEEB form, with translators on hand to provide support.
