Willow Crest Code of Conduct

At Willow Crest, we take student safety and good student behavior very seriously. We only have a few rules, but these rules apply anytime students are on campus, traveling to and from school, or on a school-sponsored field trip or activity. School staff members, students, and parents all share responsibility for good student behavior. The school has the responsibility to clearly communicate and enforce student behavior in a fair, consistent, and supportive manner. Parents have the responsibility to reinforce the expectations of the school and to help their children become responsible citizens. Students have the responsibility to follow the code of conduct and to make good choices.

Our Code of Conduct

All students will be asked to follow the Willow Crest Code of Conduct. The students will be asked to sign a poster hanging in the class committing to the Willow Crest Code of Conduct.

Willow Crest Dress Code

All students will wear school appropriate clothing with positive messages. Students and staff are encouraged to wear college colors or gear on Wednesdays and school spirit wear or school colors on Fridays.

Things to Keep at Home

- 1. Personal items. These include, but are not limited to:
 - Any toys, including items such as trading cards
 - Electronic devices, such as Ipods, airpods, tablets, handheld video games
 - Sports equipment, such as footballs, basketballs, tennis balls, or soccer balls
 - Anything with wheels (skates, skateboards, scooters, and heely shoes)
- 2. Weapons, or simulated weapons, may NEVER be brought to school. These include, but are not limited to, squirt guns, air powered guns, knives, pocket knives, explosives, and all other dangerous objects.

Phones

Cell phones are not necessary at school. If a parent chooses to send their student to school with a phone, they are responsible for it. Phones must be turned off and put away during the school day, including before school and/or during extended day programs.

Food

Due to many food allergies, you may not share food or snacks. Food may only be shared when supervised by a staff member for class parties and/or birthdays. If food is brought for a class party, then food must be store bought with ingredients listed.

Crosswalk and Parking Lot

Students walking to and from school must use the school crosswalk and stay on the sidewalks surrounding the parking lot. Students should follow safe walking routes. Students 2nd grade and younger must be picked up by an adult if not walking with older siblings.

Trait of the Month Awards

Teachers will give monthly Trait of the Month Awards to students exemplifying the character trait Willow Crest is focusing on that month. Students will know the trait ahead of time and can be working to show that trait. The awards will be presented at the monthly assembly.

Self-Managers

Students in grades 1-5 who are following the 4 Bs can be nominated by their teacher to become a Self-Manager. Self-Managers can attend a monthly party held here at school as well as have extra responsibilities in their classroom!

Soaring Owls

Staff members can recognize students who are really going above and beyond the 4 Bs by having them go to the office and sign the Principal's book after giving them a Soaring Owl. Students who get to sign the book also have their names read in the morning announcements, get to take home a written form to show their family, and will be entered into a monthly drawing to do something special with Mr. Holloman or Mr. Dudley.

Willow Crest Behavior Management Plan

Path to Success

If you need help remembering and following the Willow Crest 4Bs, these are the consequences:

1st Step: Whoops! I need a little reminder.

Teacher will remind you of the 4 Bs and remind you of expected behavior. Teacher will give a warning that your behavior is unexpected and that it is stopping you or others from learning. Teacher will remind you of the 4Bs of our school.

2nd Step: **Try Something Different**

Teacher will help you move location, remove the distraction, give space, or another teacher intervention. They may ask, "What can I do to help you, is there anything I need to know that is going on?"

3rd Step: **Turn Around Time**

Teacher will ask you to fill out a **Turn Around Time** to support you in following the 4 Bs. This will support you in being ready to return to learning. This will be in your classroom in a spot that best supports your reset. Turn around times may lead to a call to family.

4th Step: Outside Support Needed

There will be a call office for Principal, AP, Counselor, or Whole Child Specialist. This might include support coming into the classroom, time in the office and/or a phone call to parents by office.

Consequences

Any Willow Crest staff member may choose to issue a natural or logical consequence in any situation where it would be appropriate. Violations will be referred to the office for further disciplinary actions. If parents or guardians have any questions they may contact the classroom teacher or the Willow Crest office.

Consequences for Misconduct

Consequences for Misconduct are used to record disciplinary instances when students violate the Willow Crest 4 B's. A phone call from the office or a copy of the Misconduct Form will be sent home for the parent to sign and return to school the following day.

First Consequence for Misconduct – Student referred to the office, call home, discussion with teacher, and possible loss of recess or other appropriate consequence.

Second Consequence for Misconduct – Student referred to the office, call home, teacher conference to discuss behavior interventions, disciplinary action.

Third Consequence for Misconduct – Student referred to the office, disciplinary action, individual student behavior contract, parent teacher conference.

Willow Crest Academic Expectations
